## Synopsis:

Atlas of Remote Islands is a contemporary opera by composer Nathan Hall, based on the 2009 book by Judith Schalansky, produced and realized by Opera on Tap Colorado, with the libretto by Alan Olejniczak. This mysterious book is an atlas of fifty real, remote islands, stuffed with maps and prose-poem stories, more for the imagination than for navigation and offering more questions than answers. The audience experiences the histories and facts, lore, and fantasies of these islands through the eyes of this main character—who in exploring distant worlds through the pages of the atlas unlocks worlds within themself. No matter where we are, we always bring ourselves.

This modular and flexible opera uses at least six solo voices, video projections, simple staging, and a few set pieces. It's made up of fifty-two songs and ensemble pieces with five instrumental transitions that may be presented in no particular order.
